## Ham 21 - Hand-held Tuning Checklist

- 1. Although you have your radio programmed, there is an apprehension about doing things wrong or messing up.
  - a. Mic-fright strikes even professional speakers.
  - b. This is ham radio. Unless you interfere with another station, you can be you.
  - c. Even after seeing all the things you can do, a quick checklist is often handy if you are a little uncomfortable.
- 2. Fundamentals of Baofeng Radio to select mode.
  - d. Turn on radio.
  - e. Press VFO/MR key to get to channel mode.
  - f. Frequency mode (VFO) operates from a variable frequency oscillator. Only frequencies are displayed.
  - g. Channel mode (MR) is memory recall from stored channels programed in the memory. Channel number shows.
- 3. Using the channel mode.
  - a. Look at screen to see which frequencies are on.
  - b. Use up/down arrows on keypad to switch between frequencies.
  - c. Use blue A/B button to switch between top line and bottom line of display.
  - d. On the left, an up arrow shows if the top line is selected and a down arrow shows if the bottom line is selected.
  - e. The display has been programmed to show frequency on the top line. The bottom line shows the name of the frequency.
  - f. The right side of the screen shows the memory channel number.
  - g. By putting the same channel number in both top and bottom, you can see the frequency and the name.
- 4. This is a specific example for frequencies. You may well use others.
  - a. Switch to top line.
  - b. Scroll through memory channels until Mem 89, frequency 146.805, shows on the top line.
  - c. Now you are listening to the TRO repeater we monitor.
  - d. Switch to bottom line.
  - e. Scroll through memory channels until Mem 12, ARES SimpleX, shows on the bottom line.
  - f. Now you are listening to the commonly used simplex channel without a repeater.
  - g. This set-up is for talking directly between radios without an intermediary.
  - h. Typically, you may move off this channel to another unused channel for conversations.
  - i. Use the A/B switch to toggle between the upper line and the lower line to use repeater or simplex.
- 5. To see a list of channel number, frequencies, and name, print off the .CSV file used for programming the radio.
- 6. Push the PTT button on the side to talk. Release to listen.
- 7. Life is good. Enjoy.
