## Ham 47E - ASL User: Made Simple

- 1. Welcome to the EGC linked NET.
- 2. The Net runs on Monday night at 7PM.
  - a. Connect early.
  - b. Invariably someone has a challenge getting connected each week.
- 3. Call-in using one of the methods with which you have the equipment and know sort-of how to use.
  - a. If you are using a radio, connect to the VHF repeater on 145.250, negative offset, PL 141.3.
  - b. If you are using an AllStarLink node, connect to 584801.
- 4. Notice: We have a permanent home. It is unnecessary to find the net controller in order to connect.
- 5. This is the inauguration of a linked system using radios, handi-talkies, AllStarLink, and phones.
- 6. It is transparent.
  - a. Nothing else changes.
  - b. Use choice of device to connect.
  - c. Use your normal technique and skills to communicate.
  - d. All systems are converted to digital on a Raspberry Pi in a little orange printed case, setting at the repeater.
  - e. The app is AllStarLink.
  - f. Then you are talking to anyone connected, regardless of device.
  - g. It is that simple for the user.
- 7. Why do we do a Net?
  - a. To test our equipment, to check communications with others, and to develop skills.
  - b. To develop emergency communications, before they are needed.
  - c. Not all emergencies are the same. So, the ability to use many options and tools becomes necessary.
- 8. For communications to occur in an emergency or just to visit, consider leaving your device of choice on.
  - a. Myself and others leave our radio on 24/7. Although in a separate room, I do turn volume down some at night.
  - b. I also leave on a Local / Link node as a development tool. The end device changes.
  - c. If you prefer, you can now leave EchoLink connected or an AllStarLink device.
  - d. Call someone today. We encourage use of ham equipment often. They need you. Ham takes at least two.
- 9. Why is this event so significant?
  - a. A year ago, the Evergreen Communications Group (ECG) was just starting.
  - b. The first class was conducted in December.
  - c. The first ham licenses were earned on December 18, 2021.
  - d. In one year, we have 71 on our list.
  - e. Some people have gone from no license to earn their Technician, General, and Extra. Awesome.
  - f. Many have excellent stations to combat our difficult conditions, terrain, and interference.
  - g. The group has a repeater, open to anyone of similar interests.
  - h. Now, with the link system, anyone can communicate from anywhere to the group.
  - i. Further, you can communicate to anywhere to anyone with ham equipment.
  - j. What a difference a year makes. What a difference.
